Primary Care

By appointment,while the office is open

- Sore throat
- Ear pain
- · Animal or insect bite
- Fever over 101.5°
- Urinary tract infections
- Other non-emergency health needs

Urgent Care

No appointment necessary, when clinic is open*

- Cold, flu or sinus pain
- Sprain
- Rashes and minor burns
- Sore throat
- Ear pain
- Animal or insect bite
- Fever over 101.5°
- Minor cuts and scrapes, including stiches
- · Urinary tract infections
- Other non-emergency health needs

ER

Open 24/7/365

- · Sudden shortness of breath
- · Intense chest pain
- Severe and sudden stomach pain
- Broken bone
- · Severe burn or bleeding
- Open wounds
- Severe headache or head injury
- Sudden weakness
- Loss of vision
- Suicidal thoughts or thoughts of hurting others
