**Why SFFM:** "Its beautiful history of help and service to those in need."

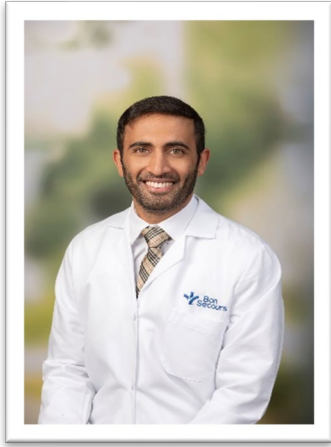
